## Year 6



The children have really got the hang of Y5 and are working so hard! In English this week, we have written our character descriptions of Grace O'Malley. The children have used some excellent vocabulary, and the teachers have really enjoyed reading their work. In maths, we have continued working on addition, using our skills to answer word problems. We have also started looking at subtraction using numbers up to 6 digits! We have started looking at the Kings and Queens of the Tudor reign in history, and in reading we read about Lady Jane Grey, who only reigned for 9 days!

Keep up the great work Year 5!

Year 6 pupils have been astounding this week! They have shown such remarkable perseverance, determination, and resilience as they face their first SATs practice test which we give as a baseline. If they have come home and given you numbers relating to the scores, this is what they mean: 100-109 is working at the expected level at the END of Y6, 110 and above is working at Greater Depth at the END of Y6. We are at the beginning of this journey, so this gives us a clear idea of strengths and gaps - of individuals and classes. It also gives the children the opportunity to know what it is like, what the timings are like so by the time they get to May, there are no surprises for them. Aside from that, we have had an excellent science lesson problem solving and identifying issues with circuits as well as creating our own circuit diagrams! In history, we have looked at the reasons war began, and which countries aligned to the different sides. We have also been fortunate to have children bring in items and family stories which we will share with the year group next week. Some of you may have seen the RE work about what a soul might look like and how it could affect your behaviour if others could see it. We have loved hearing the ideas and philosophical discussions.
