One was about the reasons Henry VIII set up the Church of England, and one about Tudor crime and punishment. The end of the 1st term of Year 6 is in sight and the children should be so proud of how well they have settled in and adopted the mantle of AJA role models. In maths, we continue to add to the list of reasons we need to learn our times tables through studying factors, multiples, prime, squared and cubed numbers! In English, we are using 'Goodnight Mr Tom' as inspiration for our diary writing. This looks at the life of an evacuee which works well with our history where we are learning about evacuees through our analyses of different sources, looking at bias and the reliability of newspaper reports, historical fiction and personal memoirs. Perhaps the most exciting event this week has been the beginning of our DT topic - creating a model of an Anderson Shelter from mesh and mod roc.
