#### A message from Mrs Bower

It has been a wonderful start to the school year. You will have seen our latest Ofsted report that was emailed to you last week. If you would like a paper copy, please ask in the school office. In the report, it states that pupils feel safe and happy at AJA and that they enjoy attending. It describes AJA as calm and orderly, and a place where pupils can learn. This is exactly what I have seen this week. Behaviour across the academy, and in every classroom, has been excellent and our fabulous new Year 3 pupils have settled in well. To expand our personal development offer, we have made improvements to the after-school clubs. All clubs are now free. We have increased the number of places to 110 pupils each term which is nearly one third of the school. 

#### Year 3

In English, we have started studying Terry Deary's The Pirate Queen. The children have enjoyed hearing about her exploits and are looking forward to writing a character description of her next week. In maths, we have started with place value: reading, writing, ordering and comparing numbers up to a million! Our history topic of the Tudors started really well with a timeline of major Tudor events. Ask the children how many they can remember! In science we started our topic of forces with a study of gravity, looking at Isaac newton and how gravity works. It's been great to see how many children are reading regularly.
