Coming up.....

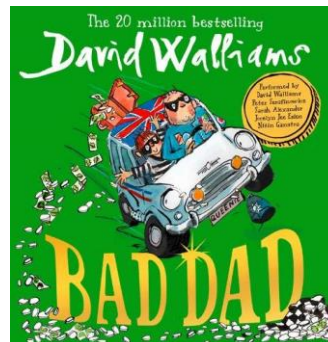
