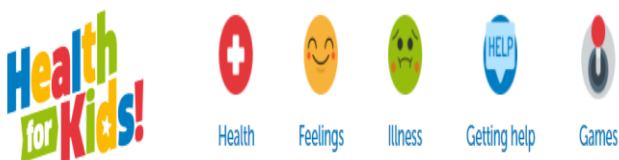


HAVE A GREAT, RESTFUL HALF TERM EVERYONE!

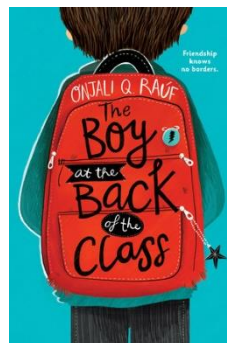
